

Libero Serving Procedures

For the 2010 season the libero will be allowed to serve in CEVA Region events

The libero is permitted to serve in 1 rotation. The libero is not required to leave the court for one rally when they are rotating to the serving position. For all other libero replacements a rally must be completed prior to the exchange. When the libero is not serving, they can only be replaced by the player whom they replaced. All other actions involving the libero will fall under the guidelines set forth in the 2009-2011 DCR, rule 19.3, pages 58-60.

A libero who has already served in 1 rotation may not serve in another rotation for any reason. This action will be handled like any wrong server situation. Allow the libero to serve in the incorrect rotation, then inform the R2 of a wrong server. If the head coach or captain requests a line-up check prior to the serve, you must give them the correct information, thus preventing a wrong server.

The first time a libero serves, a triangle is placed around the POSITION number (Roman numeral) where they serve. It is not necessary to indicate the player number for whom they serve, as any legal sub can be entered into that position during the set. In addition, any points scored by the libero should have a triangle around them in the running score column. A sample is illustrated below.

The libero tracker will also mark the rotation where the libero serves. The sideline exchange will still occur, but in this case it will be between the two regular players. Using the illustration below, the libero serves in position IV. Player #5 will replace the libero, and Player #8 will come off the court as the libero goes directly to the service zone. When Player #8 returns the libero must be off the court for one rally.
